

- I. Make homeschool teaching easier
  - A. Students close in age can be taught the same subject material at the same time in all subjects with some variations.
  - B. Students far apart in age or grade level can be taught the same subject at the same time for certain subjects.
- II. Subjects that can and cannot be taught “multi-level” if students are far apart in age or grade level.

B. Preview material.

1. Make bibliography.
2. Categorize and cull according to difficulty and content.
3. Xerox, copy, or print out sections needed. (If possible or applicable)

V. How to build a plan of study?

A. Decide how material should be used.

1. Reading aloud
2. Memorizing
- 3 Copying into notebooks or folders

B. Give student material according to level of ability.

VI. Teaching techniques

A. Students share as much of the work as ability allows.

1. Oral reports - other students take notes
  2. Oral reading and discussions of material
  3. Display art and craft projects
  4. Recite memory work orally
  5. Field trips and writing field reports
- B. Writing essays at the end of a study
1. Everyone is to write an report or essay on their level.
  2. Use props if applicable to help illustrate or explain report or essay.
  3. Give reports or essays orally.
    - a. Make copies of outline and extra material for the listeners
    - b. Make notes on other students oral essays.
- C. Test the student on his level.
- D. All information should be put into a labeled notebook and filed for student's later use.
